

The biennial Brisbane Catholic Education (BCE) Listens Survey is an opportunity for the school's key partners to help shape the future of the school. The 2020 survey was conducted between 17 August and 6 September and collected the views of families, students and staff on important aspects of the school experience, including learning and teaching, wellbeing, Catholic identity and leadership. This survey report provides information on where the school is doing well and opportunities to improve. The survey results will be used by the school to develop better learning and working environments.


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TIMING OF SCHOOL CHOICE (% respondents)





UNDERSTANDING THE BCE LISTENS SURVEY THEMES

Learning and teaching: perceptions regarding the mindset of teachers, and the learning opportunities available at the school.

Catholic identity: perceptions of how the school contributes to developing students and parents' understanding of faith, and how the school communicates its Catholic identity.

Leadership and support: perceptions of school improvement, and school leaders' engagement and effectiveness.

Personal development: perceptions of school's role in fostering students' holistic growth. **Relationships:** perceptions of the parent-teacher relationship.

Diversity and inclusion: perceptions of whether the school celebrates and responds to the individual identities and the diverse backgrounds of students.

Wellbeing: examines whether parents believe their child feels accepted, happy and safe at the school, how bullying is dealt with, and the overall atmosphere of the school.

Student protection: the extent of parents knowledge of student protection processes and contacts. Facilities: perceptions about the school environment and whether it support student learning.
