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## **Homework Policy**

Homework provides an opportunity for parents/caregivers to be involved and support their children's learning and should become part of a student's daily routine. Through homework activities the student has the opportunity to consolidate class work and practise skills at home.

At St Joseph's we believe that homework should not cause family stress or jeopardise the right of children to enjoy a balanced lifestyle. Our approach supports the importance of family time, community and cultural activities, relaxation and play and acknowledges the varied outside school hours activities in which the students participate.

Consistent and effective implementation of our homework policy occurs throughout the school including a consistent approach across each year level. This takes into account the amount of time students are to spend in completing homework and ensuring that students are not disadvantaged by a lack of access to resources (such as computers and the internet) outside the school. Appropriate supports should be put in place for the successful completion of homework (e.g. through provision of resources, extra support for students struggling to complete homework etc.).
